



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/14

Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Extension of Time Granted to the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 16 August 2016, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2016/77, available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 5 December 2016. The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary) in relation to this investigation.¹

The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary would be made in a final report on or before 18 January 2017, unless the investigation was terminated. The deadlines for publishing the SEF and for providing the final report were previously extended to 2 February 2017 and 20 March 2017 respectively, as outlined in ADN 2016/126.

To enable completion of verification I, Rhys Piper, Acting General Manager, Investigations, requested a further extension of time under subsections 269ZHI(1)(a) and 269ZHI(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) to the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and submit his final report to the Parliamentary Secretary.²

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act,³ extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF and submission of his final report and recommendation by 45 days. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 20 March 2017.⁴ Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a final report due on or before 3 May 2017, unless the investigation is terminated.
