



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/56

Aluminium road wheels

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report in a continuation inquiry

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 27 October 2016, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an inquiry into whether the continuation of anti-dumping measures applying to aluminium road wheels exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China is justified.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2016/109. This ADN is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (the Commission's) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The notice initiating this inquiry (the initiation notice) advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) in relation to this inquiry would be placed on the public record by 14 February 2017. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary),¹ would be made in a final report on or before 31 March 2017.

Following extensions of the deadlines to publish the SEF and to provide the final report and recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary, ADN No. 2017/12 notified interested parties that the SEF would be placed on the public record by 14 March 2017, and the final report and recommendation would be provided by 28 April 2017. The SEF was placed on the public record on 15 March 2017.

To enable the Commission to complete the verification of Zhejiang Yueling Co., Ltd, publish the outcome of that verification, and to give interested parties an opportunity to comment, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager Investigations, requested an extension to the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary under subsection 269ZHI(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).²

For the purposes of this inquiry, the Minister is the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science.

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for providing the Parliamentary Secretary with his final report and recommendation. The recommendation will now be made in a report due on or before **19 May 2017**.
