ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/132

Approved forms for applications and withdrawals

I, Paul Sexton, Acting Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, have approved a new form to be used in an application for an accelerated review. I have also approved revised forms for making a range of other applications, and for withdrawing applications for a dumping duty notice or countervailing duty notice.

As authorised under subsection 269SMS(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I have approved Form ADC1 for the purposes of submitting an application for an accelerated review under subsection 269ZE(1) of the Act.

Only a new exporter is eligible to apply for an accelerated review. A new exporter means that, in relation to goods the subject of an application for a dumping duty notice or a countervailing duty notice or like goods, an exporter who did not export such goods to Australia at any time during the investigation period in relation to the application (subsections 269ZE(1) and 269T(1) of the Act refer).
