Notice for longer period for the decision of the Minister for Industry,
Science and Technology

Customs Act 1901

Public notice under subsection 269TLA(3)

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an investigation into the alleged dumping of Alloy Round Bar exported to Australia from China.

Copies of the application and various submissions made in relation to the investigation are available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The Commissioner provided his final report and recommendations to me on 6 February 2019. Subsection 269TLA(2)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) requires the relevant Minister to make their decision on the outcome of this investigation within 30 days after receiving the Commissioner's report, that is, by **8 March 2019**.

Where there are special circumstances that prevent the decision being made within that period, subsection 269TLA(2)(b) of the Act provides that the decision may be within such longer period as the Minister considers appropriate.

I consider there are special circumstances and that it is appropriate under subsection 269TLA(2) of the Act to extend the period for making my decision for a further **30 days to 8 April 2019**¹ in order to properly consider the Commissioner's final report and recommendations.
