## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/139**

### **Hot rolled structural steel**

### **Exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea**

### **Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report to the Minister**

### **in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No. 465**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

On 19 March 2018, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice, in respect of hot rolled structural steel sections (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea as they affect exporters of those goods generally.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/44 (initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The initiation notice advised that a recommendation to the then Minister would be made in a final report on or before 21 August 2018. This deadline was previously extended by the Commissioner until 11 September 2018 as advised in ADN No. 2018/107.<sup>1</sup>

Due to the complexity of submissions received following publication of the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF), I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission,<sup>2</sup> requested a further extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.<sup>3</sup>

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister. The final report and recommendation to the Minister will now be made on or before 30 October 2018.
