## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2019/12**

### **Certain Railway Wheels**

**Exported from the People’s Republic of China and France**

### **Termination of Investigation (Investigation No. 466)**

#### ***Public notice under subsection 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901***

On 18 April 2018, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, initiated investigations into the alleged dumping and countervailable subsidisation of certain railway wheels (the goods) exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China (China) and the alleged dumping of the goods exported to Australia from France, following an application lodged by Commonwealth Steel Company Pty Ltd (the applicant) under subsection 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

Public notice of my decision to not reject the application and to initiate the investigation was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission’s (Commission’s) website on 18 April 2018. The Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN No. 2018/59) is available at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

As a result of the investigation, I am satisfied that in relation to all exporters from China, countervailable subsidies have been received in respect of some or all of the goods, but the subsidy margin never, at any time during the investigation period, exceeded the negligible level of countervailable subsidy as defined by subsection 269TDA(16) of the Act. I therefore terminate the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(2) of the Act.

In making this decision to terminate, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, *Statement of Essential Facts No. 466* and submissions in response to *Statement of Essential Facts No. 466*.

*Termination Report No. 466*, which sets out my reasons for this termination decision, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decision is based, has been placed on the public record which can be found on the Commission’s website at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The applicant may request a review of this decision to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days after the first publication of this notice.
