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## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/129**

**Review of measures relating to certain food service and  
industrial pineapple fruit**

**exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand by  
Prime Products Industry Co., Ltd**

**Extension of time granted to issue the  
Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report for  
Review No. 477**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

On 10 May 2018, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures relating to certain food service and industrial pineapple fruit (the goods) exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand) by Prime Products Industry Co., Ltd (PPI).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/76. This ADN is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the review would be placed on the public record by 28 August 2018. The initiation notice advised that the SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the relevant Minister.

The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the relevant Minister would be made in a final report on or before 12 October 2018.

As further time is required to verify information received in relation to Review No. 477, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission<sup>1</sup>, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation (the Assistant Minister)<sup>2</sup> in relation to Review No. 477.

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,<sup>3</sup> extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation to the Assistant Minister in relation to Review No. 477.

The SEF for Review No. 477 will now be placed on the public record no later than 27 September 2018. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Assistant Minister for Review No. 477 will now be made in a report due on or before 12 November 2018.<sup>4</sup>
