



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/123

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from The People’s Republic of China

Termination of Accelerated Review 485

Anhui Tongxi Jinpeng Aluminum Co., Ltd

Introduction

On 9 July 2018, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, published Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/110 to notify interested parties that an accelerated review of the anti-dumping measures applying to certain aluminium extrusions (‘the goods’) exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China (China), in so far as they relate to the new exporter, Anhui Tongxi Jinpeng Aluminum Co., Ltd (Tongxi Jinpeng or ‘the applicant’) had commenced. The application lodgement date of 19 June 2018 was the commencement date of the accelerated review.

Pursuant to subsection 269ZH(b) of the *Customs Act 1901*¹ (the Act), the Commonwealth required securities in respect of interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty that may be payable on exports of the goods by the applicant for the period of the accelerated review.

Grounds for termination

On 17 July 2018, Tongxi Jinpeng notified the Commission by way of email that it wished to withdraw its application for an accelerated review. Following that notification, I am satisfied that the accelerated review may be terminated under subsection 269ZE(3) of the Act and have terminated it as such.

Effect of the termination

Termination of this accelerated review means that any securities required and taken in relation to the goods exported by the applicant and entered for home consumption from 19 June 2018 will now be converted to interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty.

The applicable rates of duty are the 'Uncooperative and all other exporters' rates of interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty. The applicable rates are specified in the notice published on 10 November 2017 (ADN No.2017/138). Future exports of the goods by the applicant will be subject to these rates of duty.

Termination of the accelerated review does not affect the applicant's right to apply for another accelerated review.
