



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/156

Review of anti-dumping measures 490 in relation to

Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from Malaysia by Alumac Industries Sdn Bhd

**Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of
Essential Facts and the Final Report**

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 24 August 2018, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures applying to certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from Malaysia. The review is examining whether the countervailing duty notice relevant to the taking of anti-dumping measures, as they affect Alumac Industries Sdn Bhd (Alumac), should be revoked.

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/132. This ADN is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission's) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

ADN 2018/132 advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF 490) for the review would be placed on the public record on or before 12 December 2018. It also advised that a recommendation to the Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation would be made in a final report on or before 29 January 2019.

On 27 September 2018, the Commissioner initiated a review of variable factors (REV 494) relevant to the taking of anti-dumping measures with respect to exports by Alumac from Malaysia to Australia (refer to ADN 2018/149).

Due to the near identical case characteristics and for resourcing efficiency, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish SEF 490 and provide his final report, REP 490, and recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology

(the Minister).¹² This extension will align the relevant dates to those dates with respect to REV 494.

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,³ extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.

SEF 490 will now be placed on the public record on or before **15 January 2019**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to SEF 490 within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister, with respect to REV 490, will now be made in a report due on or before **1 March 2019**
