Australian Customs Dumping Notice
No. 2000/22

CUSTOMS ACT 1901 - PART XVB
SPECIAL PROVISIONS RELATING TO ANTI-DUMPING DUTIES

**FINDING ON POLYVINYL CHLORIDE BOTTLE
COMPOUND EXPORTED FROM SINGAPORE**

The Australian Customs Service has completed its investigation into the alleged dumping of polyvinyl chloride bottle compound (the goods) exported to Australia from Singapore.

Customs concluded that:

- there have been exports of the goods from Singapore at dumped prices;
- the Australian industry has suffered injury;
- dumped imports have caused material injury to the Australian industry producing like goods; and
- material injury would continue to be caused to the Australian industry if the goods continue to be exported to Australia at dumped prices.

Customs recommended to the minister that anti-dumping action be taken against imports of the goods from Singapore.

The minister has accepted Customs recommendations. Measures therefore apply to goods entered for home consumption on or after 27 January 2000.

Notice of this decision appeared in the *Financial Review* of 19 April 2000. The measures reveal confidential details of the activities of the company concerned and therefore the normal values, export prices and non-injurious prices will not be publicly advertised. The company has been advised of the measures applicable to its transactions.

Interested parties may request the Trade Measures Review Officer to review the minister's decision. An application for review must be lodged within thirty days the publication of this notice and be in the approved form and manner. The legislation relating to the review of ministerial decisions is set out in the Customs Act commencing at s. 269ZZA.
