**Australian Customs Dumping Notice**

CUSTOMS ACT 1901 - PART XVB

**CESSATION OF AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING  
OF CERTAIN DISC BRAKE ROTORS FROM ITALY, TAIWAN AND  
THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA**

On 19 September 2000 the Australian Customs Service (Customs) initiated an investigation into an application lodged by Disc Brakes Australia Pty Ltd (DBA), for a dumping duty notice in respect of certain disc brake rotors (rotors) exported to Australia from Italy, Taiwan and The People's Republic of China.

A notice under s. 269TC(4) of the *Customs Act 1901* advising the initiation of this investigation was published in the *Australian Financial Review* on 19 September 2000. ACDN No. 2000/045 was also published to notify interested parties of the investigation.

As a result of Customs inquiries to date and in response to a submission from an interested party, Customs revisited the calculation of support for the application under s. 269TB(6) of the Act. Customs is now satisfied that the persons (including the applicant) who produce or manufacture like goods in Australia and who support the application account for less than 25% of the total production or manufacture of like goods in Australia.

Customs is of the opinion that there is no basis for the investigation to continue. Therefore, Customs has ceased its investigations concerning the application and no findings will be made on the allegations of dumping, material injury and causal link.
