## **Australian Customs Dumping Notice No. 2000/6**

CUSTOMS ACT 1901 - PART XV B

### **NOTIFICATION OF FINDING**

### **REVIEW OF NON-INJURIOUS PRICES APPLYING TO CLEAR FLOAT GLASS FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA, THE PHILIPPINES, SINGAPORE AND THAILAND**

On 23 December 1998 the Australian Customs Service (Customs) notified the commencement of a review of non-injurious prices applying to exports of clear float glass from the People's Republic of China (China), the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand.

The Minister for Justice and Customs has accepted Customs recommendations and has agreed to alter the existing anti-dumping measures. Notices signed by the Minister in respect of exports from China, the Philippines and Thailand were published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* on 7 February 2000. Anti-dumping measures for Singapore lapsed on 24 August 1999 and therefore are not in force.

The measures include confidential details of the companies concerned and these figures will not be published as this may adversely affect the business or commercial interests of certain interested parties. The new non-injurious prices apply to clear float glass entered for home consumption on and after 7 February 2000.

Bona fide importers of the goods can obtain details of the new rates from the Trade Facilitation Branch of Customs in their respective capital city.
